★ The Playwork Inclusion Project (PIP)

Training Courses

★ **Planning Inclusive Play - endorsed at level 3***

An in depth course run over 6 days to increase your knowledge and practical understanding of inclusive play and its application in policy development

★ **Let's All Play ! - endorsed at level 2***

A one day course introducing participants to the principles of inclusive play through games and activities

★ **Let's All Play Outdoors ! - endorsed at level 2***

A one day course introducing participants to the principles of inclusive play with a focus on outdoor games and activities

★ **Implementing the All of Us Framework for Inclusion**

A one day course using **All of Us** as a framework for working inclusively in play and childcare settings

★ **Assessing through the All of Us Framework for Inclusion**

A half day course aimed at development officers working within Quality Assessment frameworks, assessors and mentors

★ **In on the Act (formerly Just because the law says so)**

Can be run as a half day or one day course. Provides an overview of disability and equalities legislation and how to apply it to promote inclusion and challenge disablism

★ **Exploring Inclusion Out of School**

Developed as a 'train the trainer' course, this one day course is aimed at those working with disabled young people in extended services

KIDS also offers a range of training courses run in partnership with **Alison John & Associates and Playworks UK**

★ **Five Ways**

A two day course aimed at giving parents/carers of disabled children the confidence to play with their children, to allow them to take risks, to give them new experiences and to empower them to have their disabled children's rights met.

★ **Play2gether**

A one day interactive course endorsed by Skills Active at level 2 aimed at supporting play and early years workers to provide an inclusive, playful environment for disabled and non-disabled children.

★ **Everyone Can Play** - endorsed at level 2

★ **Playing on the range** - endorsed at level 2

★ **Playing with the elements** - endorsed at level 3

* It is anticipated that all these courses will achieve full endorsement by April 2010.

The Playwork Inclusion Project

The Playwork Inclusion Project (PIP) has been running since 2001 as a development programme aimed at increasing the numbers of disabled children in universal play and childcare.
