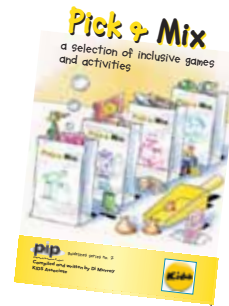
**Inclusion by Design - a guide to creating accessible play and childcare environments** (Clare Goodridge, Ed. Philip Douch 2008)
