## Practitioner barriers to young people's participation

Barrier type – young people and their needs

These barriers were identified at the Making Participation Work Practitioner Conference in October 2022.

Methods of overcoming came from fellow practitioners and young people who are part of The Collective

Reach out to the community – community leaders and informal groups may be able to help engage YP and gatekeepers



Ask YP to define how they are involved and what topics


audio/video options using avatars created by the young person

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Get experienced YP to engage their peers



Barrier –

Engaging YP outside of forums and those reluctant to engage (reasons may be that you don't have the relationships or that YP are not trusting of practitioners/ adults

Share how YP have previously been involved and the impact they made



Having volunteers that YP can see themselves represented in

Bring a YP from your group this can help engage other YP who may be nervous



Places like the doctors' surgeries are important to remember to advertise



Put up posters in community spaces

Barrier –
Accessing YP who are not in employment, education, or training (NEET)



Use social media









Advertise to parents – they are often looking for something to get YP out of the house or to do something



Offer information in different formats and allow YP to choose what they engage with and how



Pairing up YP for shadowing and peer support

Delivering groups for both YP with SEND and those without



Offer a range of activities for YP to participate in
