1. What is the Advisory Panel?



A group who shares ideas, advice and real-life experiences to make digital services (like websites or apps) work better for disabled people and their families.

2. What will the group do?



Help design and check the programme
Talk about what makes it hard or easy to
use digital technology
Come up with new ideas that work for
young people and families
Make sure disabled children with health
problems are included

3. Who can join?



Young people aged 13–25
Parents or carers of disabled children
From different backgrounds, places, and types
of disability

4. What will members do?



Go to online meetings and share their ideas and views



Help test digital tools and services



Speak up for digital inclusion in their community

The programme team will:



Give easy to understand information and easy reads



Listen to feedback and make changes

5. How will the group work?



Meetings will be led by the CEO or another leader

Sometimes, a young person or parent will help lead the meeting

6. How long is it for?



There will be 2 main meetings each year

You will join for 1 year but could stay longer

7. Keeping everyone safe



Everyone must respect privacy Young people will need consent to join Safeguarding rules will keep people safe

8. Money



You will get vouchers for your time and any travel costs
